Federal Judge Rules Against Mother's Hague Petition to Remove Son from US Father to Mexico

Chicago, IL, March 11, 2016 – Thanks to the Law Offices of Jeffery M. Leving, Ltd., a nine-year-old boy will continue to live with his father in the United States despite underhanded attempts by his mother to take him out of the country permanently to Mexico.
